



MEN-IN-FELLOWSHIP BREAKFAST WITH CHRIS & DENISE ARTHEY

On 15th November, the Men in Fellowship gathered for a breakfast, where we heard the extraordinary story of Chris and Denise Arthey, entitled "Highway 35".

In 2008, whilst living in Texas, they were involved in a major motorcycle accident on Highway 35, caused by a drink-driver of a car, resulting in severe injuries. Their massive injuries included both losing their left leg and despite the severity and bleak outlook of their circumstances, they told us about their story of faith, forgiveness, and hope for the future.

Not only have they recovered their love of life, but also much of their physical fitness. Chris has gone on to run marathons and climb mountains with his prosthetic leg, and they are both ambassadors for the prosthetics industry, regularly participating in trials of new innovations.



Remarkably, they have wholly forgiven the individual responsible for the accident and even meet with him regularly.

It was an extraordinary and captivating story, which prompted much discussion among those attending.

"THE GOLDEN STAIRS" BY EDWARD BURNE-JONES (1833-1898)

Some of you may not be familiar with this painting. The first time I saw it many years ago in an exhibition of Pre-Raphaelite artists I was transfixed.

The picture portrays a winding staircase down which are processing 18 females all dressed in loose fitting gowns of the same colour and style, their hair garlanded with leaves. Where they have come from or are going to is a mystery. Certain of the females are carrying musical instruments. Burne-Jones' figures have a wistful, ethereal air about them and he was famous for his paintings of stories of medieval romantic myths and legends.

The reason this painting is special is that in St. John's we have a stained glass window that I call our version of the "The Golden Stairs". Whether or not there is a connection between the two works I rather doubt though Burne-Jones did produce much religious stained glass - our version has angels, for example, that are processing as if from one stained glass window to the other.

I've always loved these windows with their red and gold colouring and the soft, pale green of the reeds held by the angels. They're situated to the right of the old altar and on sunny mornings catch the rays of the sun to marvellous effect. I'm sure you've seen them. Amongst a significant body of work Burne-Jones executed a series of paintings called "The Briar Rose" that depict the story of Sleeping Beauty (or Briarose). The female figures are so lifelike that it seems almost possible to step into these paintings and gently wake them from their deep slumbers.

The series of paintings was accompanied by a poem by his close friend William Morris written in 1891.

"The maiden pleasance of the land, Knoweth no stir of voice or hand."
