Collect

Merciful Lord, cast your bright beams of light upon the Church: that, being enlightened by the teaching of your blessed apostle and evangelist Saint John, we may so walk in the light of your truth that we may at last attain to the light of everlasting life; through Jesus Christ your incarnate Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Reading Revelation 1.4-8

Gospel John 20.19-end

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'
But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

First Communion Course and Baptism

Is your child aged 8 or over and interested in taking the next step on their faith journey? At St John's we have permission to admit children to communion and are aware that some of our young people are keen to take part! So, this June we will be running a course for any eligible young people consisting of three sessions, then holding their first communion Service on Sunday 13th July at 10am. To be admitted to communion in the Church of England a child must first be baptised and have gone through a preparation course. If your child has not yet been baptised, do not worry, as we are going to hold an All-Age Baptism Service on Sunday 6th July at 10am as well. Winchester Cathedral Pilgrimage - Saturday 10th May 2025

David Hunt's Sponsored Walk to Winchester Cathedral on 9th/10th May, for the Young People's Ministry Fund

On Friday 9th May, David will be setting off from St John's and walking to the top of St Marthas. From there, he will then follow the Pilgrims Way to Winchester. The Pilgrims Way roughly follows the North Down's Way to Farnham and then the St Swithun's Way to

Winchester Cathedral.

He will stay overnight at the Four Marks Travelodge and hopefully arrive at Winchester Cathedral on the Saturday morning just before 10.30am! The total length of the walk is 52 miles with the total of the climbs approaching the height of Ben Nevis!! He will be walking 35 miles on the Friday and 17 miles on the Saturday.
