

This month, on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> June, we come together for Pentecost to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. A time in the church year where we hear the story of the first apostles, how they were filled with the Holy Spirit and empowered to spread the word about Jesus! If you are coming to celebrate with us on the 8<sup>th</sup>, we have a little competition to see who has the best red outfit - red to represent the tongues of fire which appeared above the disciples' heads.... We love bringing the words of Jesus to life so that people can see, hear and engage with them; and to be

able to share that with over 1000 people a day is incredible! For more information see <a href="https://www.wintershall.org.uk/">https://www.wintershall.org.uk/</a>



## **Dave Kelly & Christine Collister 2025**

A note about the musicians performing at St John's on 21st June.

**Dave Kelly** – is a founder member of The Blues Band. The band retired in 2023... after completing their 42nd Anniversary Tour a little late – due to Covid restrictions. Dave is a stalwart of the British Blues Scene, having cut his teeth in the backing bands of Howlin' Wolf and John Lee Hooker as well as playing with Buddy Guy, Son House & Muddy Waters. The Blues Band has released about 20 albums, and Dave has 18 either solo or with his own Dave Kelly Band

**Christine Collister** - Came to prominence originally in the UK folk scene in the eighties, singing the title song for the BBC drama series *'Life & Loves Of A She Devil'*. She was in Richard Thompson's touring Band 1985-1988 as vocalist and acoustic guitarist. 1984-1990 saw five acclaimed albums with Clive Gregson with many successful collaborations since such as *Daphne's Flight; Hell Bent Heaven Bound; Wild Honey Orchestra; Iain Matthews; Loudon Wainwright III.* 

**Christine & Dave** recorded a session for *The Paul Jones Radio Two* show in 1994. A fan gave Dave a copy of that recording. Dave thought it sounded great and forwarded a copy to Christine. This resulted in a decision to get together again and do some more shows.


Their material is drawn from both their musical backgrounds, but mainly covering songs which they both love but have not previously had an opportunity to perform, within their usual formats. Some soul standards, country songs, rock, folk & blues, Stax, Tamla, The Band, Emmylou Harris, The Everly Brothers, Elvis, (to name but a few) as well as some great contemporary writers and of course, their own songs.

They had a huge success at Vancouver Island Festival in July 2018. Drawing from their mutual love of classic rock, pop, country, jazz & blues, Christine and Dave dived headlong and full throttle into the songs they love and they then toured the UK with their fabulous concert. Their combined passion, talent and fun-loving personalities bring a natural warmth and great charm to their performances.

Spring 2025 sees them return to their favourite songs and beautifully crafted harmonies.




## Transitional Cathedral, Christchurch in New Zealand

We recently had the privilege of holidaying in New Zealand and found our way to an extraordinary place.

In February 2011, Christchurch suffered a devastating earthquake which destroyed large parts of the city, killing 185 people and injuring many more. During the quake, the tower of the original neo-Gothic Cathedral collapsed. Further aftershocks destroyed the iconic rose window and cracked the whole cathedral like a plate.

Soon afterwards the Cathedral staff contacted an "emergency architect" called Shigeru Ban from Japan, who offered to design a cardboard structure as a temporary cathedral.

Two years later, the building became a reality. Made of cardboard, local wood, and steel, this simple design is a magical space whilst being earthquake proof.



The design is quite simple, with waves of cardboard tubes drawing the eye and attention towards the cross and the altar. It seats 700 yet provides a remarkable sense of space and spirituality.



Cathedrals are by nature multi-dimensional, and this building is too. It exudes quiet beauty and provides a perfect spiritual meeting place.

If you are fortunate enough to visit this beautiful country, aka Aotearoa, we recommend adding the cathedral to your itinerary.

## Help wanted with the Parish Magazine

Please consider if you could help with the Parish Magazine. The magazine is a focal point for information about our activities and makes a healthy profit for church funds. We now have one more guest editor but we need another one and an advertisements manager.

#### **Guest editor**

The guest editors generally produce two issues of the magazine a year. They are sent a document template with the magazine cover, adverts and regular pages already inserted. They then insert articles from both regular and occasional contributors and are free to add anything of particular interest to them. After proof-reading they send the completed copy to the printers.

## **Advertisements manager**

- responds to new requests for advertising and liaises with the advertisers to help them prepare their copy if necessary.
- uses Microsoft Word to insert, move around and delete adverts as required into the existing magazine template.
- invoices advertisers when their advert has appeared and issues repeat invoices to regular advertisers once a year. This has been done manually up to now by email but the church has just bought new bookkeeping software which the adverts manager will be able to use in future.
- checks with the treasurer that payments have been received. This will happen automatically with the new system.
- thanks advertisers for paying.
- each month gets the template ready for the guest editor by adding a cover photograph kindly supplied by Jane Stevenson and updating the regular text if necessary.

## **Gardening hints for June**

With no real rain forecast we could soon be in for a hosepipe ban, still at last the risk of frost has passed and we can safely plant out our tender plants into their bedding positions and look forward, we hope, to keeping them well watered throughout the warm and hot summer months ahead.

Roses should have any wild suckers (that is shoots with seven or more leaves) removed; they should then be sprayed regularly with a systemic insecticide against aphids, blackspot and mildew and fed with a rose fertiliser. Climbing and rambling roses need to be tied in as near to the horizontal as possible to encourage better flowering. Dahlias should be planted out and staked as they grow.

Dead head delphiniums and lupins to encourage a second flush of bloom. Spring flowering shrubs such as forsythia and philadelphus should be pruned after flowering. Perennial aubretia and alyssum should be trimmed after flowering to encourage new growth. Clematis, honeysuckle and sweet peas should be tied to supports as they grow. Lift tulips when the foliage is dry and papery.

Pinch out the leading shoots of chrysanthemum, fuchsia and helianthus to encourage bushy growth. Divide bearded iris after flowering.

Containerised plants should be fed once or twice a month.

In hot weather the greenhouse should be dampened down with water to maintain a humid atmosphere.

Protect delphiniums, hostas, lilies and lupins from slug and snail damage using animal and bird friendly pellets.

Indoor tomatoes should be staked and have their sideshoots removed unless they are a bush variety, start feeding when the first fruits have formed.

Brussel sprouts, winter cabbage, courgettes, purple sprouting and outdoor tomatoes should be planted out. Early potatoes should be dug as soon as they come into flower. Runner and French beans should be planted out; sow seed now for a later crop. Continue to sow small quantities of salad crops.

Thin out apple, pear and plum fruits after the natural June drop has occurred.

Make sure that newly planted shrubs and trees are kept well-watered during dry weather.

Now is a good time to sow herbs outdoors. Parsley can be slow to germinate and can be speeded up by placing the seed in the refrigerator before sowing or by pouring boiling water over the soil after sowing. French tarragon cannot be grown from seed, only by vegetative propagation while Russian tarragon which can be grown from seed is bland and tasteless.

Continue to mow the lawn frequently and apply a dressing of summer weed and feed just before rain is forecast we hope.
